StubbyDog general interest article guidelines

- Articles are usually between 500-700 words long, though they can be longer or shorter (some of the longer articles run about 2000 words, some of the shorter ones run about 450 words). See links to samples below.

- All articles will be edited for grammar and punctuation; we will do our utmost to preserve the tone and original voice of the article, but occasionally due to space or other constraints some content might be subject to editing.
- Every article should be accompanied by a minimum of 3 good quality photos of your dog; at least one should be a horizontal shot (this will be used for our home page gallery). If you describe an activity that your dog is involved in (therapy, agility), try to include at least 1 photograph of your dog doing that activity. You may submit as many photos as you like, but we reserve the right to choose and/or crop those used in the article. Keep in mind that the more high-quality photos we can include, the more compelling the story will be to the reader.
- For articles that run longer than 500 words, please try to include an additional photo for each 200 or so words beyond that (this keeps things visually interesting for the reader). For example, for a 500-700 word article, please include at least 4-5 photographs. We would always rather have too many photographs than not enough.
- Please note that it may take some time before your article is published. When the article is published, it may also be posted on other social media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter).
- Please include your name, email, and phone number with the article so that we can notify you when it is posted or reach you if we have any questions.
